As Executive Director of the Ontario Trails Council, Patrick has spent the last 11 years researching and reporting on regulation and legislation that affects trails. Then asked by the trails community he's put processes into place to reduce regulation, ease trail implementation, and change legislation. This course will assist regulators and adjusters as they assess trail placements and trail developments.

This course is a half day, 3 hour program. There are several key pieces of legislation in Ontario that affect the development, management and operation of trails. Volunteers and professionals involved in this field should be aware of these pieces of legislation and their relevance to the trails community.

We will address these items through presentations on the legislation and case law, and interactive case studies and discussion to demonstrate the scope of the law and the resulting rights and obligations under the legislation.

This course is designed to make trail builders and managers aware of the impact legislation has on the development and management of trails.
