This 1-day, 7-hour module will provide trail managers, stewards, practitioners and users with an understanding of how trails, when planned and created properly, can fit within the natural environment while providing positive user experiences.

This course combines presentation materials, open discussion, case studies, group work and site visits to provide a wide range of theories, perspectives and examples of balancing the needs of trail users while protecting the natural environment.
