Action



OTC leads the way

- Made changes with PRO/OPA/AMO in tax breaks for municipalities that develop trail
- Made changes in the MFTIP stay of MPAC adjustments
- Developed RMC's that saw development of trail in Halton Hills, and in completion of Fort Erie Port Colborne trail
- Got trail as part of municipal assessment process
- Full Participation in Land Use Management Planning Greenbelt, Pre-Budget, Occupiers Land Act, Line Fences etc.
- Providing Youth Programs through CIAF
- Providing Health-Unit Trails Event Co-ordination Province Wide
- Cooperatively working to complete the TCT trail in Ontario



Niagara Region— Regional



Mid-West Region—involves municipal, tourism, health, Woodstock, Ingersoll, Tillsonburg, Chatham-Kent, Norfolk and Haldimand

Outcomes – 3 follow-up meetings

- Pursued Trails-Health Events
- Norfolk Tour de Norfolk
- Interest from London-Middlesex
- OBR participant
- Re-alignment of trails to ensure multi-county connectivity
- \$2 million bridge development over 401
- Chatham-Kent completed, OTF grant, incorporated working on county wide bike lanes, insurance completed 220 km link of TCT and in order to complete intra-county completion of trail systems.





RMC Development



Eastern Region – Kawartha Lakes, City of Kingston, Lanark, Renfrew, EOTA; user groups, atv, snow clubs, FON, Health Units, MNR



Outcomes

- Development of RMC Glengarry Stormont Dundas – trail standards
- Renfrew consideration of EOTA and ATVOntario products
- Kingston/Frontenac participation of 2007 trails summit, WRT completion, TCT completion K and P
- Lennox and Addington, Prince Edward insurance, bridges, waterfront development, EOTA pass model
- Kawartha –Master Plan development







RMC Development Areas



Communities in development

- North of Superior –TCT completion, ATV and water routes added as uses
- Bruce Grey Region land access issues with ATV users to ensure municipal trail regulations are followed; adoption of EOTA pass model
- Haldimand farm land uses and accommodations
- Essex riverfront rail trails re-development, capital funding, and host of T4L Get Active Now presentations.


